

# QUICKBOOKS 2008 FAQ SHEET

Intuit, the parent company of Quickbooks, has discontinued support for Quickbooks 2008. This means that if something were to happen to the program, or to your Quickbooks file, their technical support would not be able to assist you. This is a risk to your account and to the files that we maintain for our clients that needs to be avoided.

<b>What happens if I don't upgrade?</b>	If you choose not to upgrade, you will lose support for your Quickbooks file and risk your data integrity in the event of some corruption.
<b>How do I upgrade?</b>	It is very easy to upgrade your Quickbooks file. <b>What will it cost me to upgrade?</b>	Depending on your needs, and the number of licensed users you have using Quickbooks, the cost will vary. You can get detailed pricing at <a href="http://www.quickbooks.com">www.quickbooks.com</a>
<b>Do I have to upgrade every year?</b>	No. Quickbooks maintains support for the latest three years of their product. Currently, versions 2009-2011 are supported. If you are using Quickbooks 2008 or prior, you should upgrade to the latest version (2011). You won't have to upgrade again for three years.
<b>Is the upgrade difficult to do?</b>	No. It is very easy. Information is available at <a href="http://www.quickbooks.com">www.quickbooks.com</a> , as well as phone support options from Quickbooks. Their support number is 800-624-2106. <b>Be sure to back up your Quickbooks file before you begin any type of upgrade.</b>
